This is one of the two portraits by artist George Caleb Bingham that hangs in the Missouri Governor's Mansion.

They were the first guest to be received at the Missouri Governor's Mansion in 1872 by Governor Gratz Brown.

The name of this former Governor is well known on both the campuses of Missouri and Washington University, where several facilities carry his name.

This First Lady gave birth to her first son only two months after her husband took office as Governor.

He was the architect of the Missouri Governor's Mansion.

This Governor served from 1845-1849 and his portrait, also by George Caleb Bingham, includes the 1st capitol building that was destroyed by fire in 1911.

Her husband served as the Governor from 1993 until his tragic death on October 16, 2000.

He was the first Governor to reside in the mansion.
